

## Meet Your Escort and Guide






## WELCOME TO THE LOWCOUNTRY



#### DAY 1 - Wednesday, March 26 - Arrival Day in Charleston

Plan to arrive at Charleston International Airport by 3:00 pm for a group transfer to check in to our hotel - Courtyard Charleston Historic District. Enjoy lunch on your own at the airport, and take some time to explore the shops near the hotel upon arrival.

Meet in lobby and depart for a welcome dinner in Susan Epstein's Garden. Enjoy a glass of wine while strolling the garden and a sumptuous Lowcountry Boil, with seafood, spicy andouille, corn and potatoes. Vegetarian options available.

After dinner, we return to our hotel. Night at Courtyard Charleston Historic District, for the first of five nights. R, D





#### DAY 2 - Thursday, March 27 - Historic Charleston

After our included breakfast, we set off on foot to explore Charleston's Historic District. Our first stop is the International African American Museum for a self-guided tour. At the museum entrance, the African Ancestors Memorial Garden reflects on the significance of the historically sacred site of Gadsden's Wharf—where alongside several others in the Charleston Harbor—an estimated 40% of African captives entered this country. Inside, exhibitions tell the dynamic story of the international African American experience.

Next, we head to City Market, a National Historic Landmark, for shopping and lunch on your own. The City Market historic complex was established in the 1790s. It stretches for four city blocks from the architecturally significant Market Hall, through a continuous series of one-story market sheds.

In early afternoon, we meet Susan Epstein for a walking tour of some of downtown's most iconic private gardens.

After our tour we return to our hotel for dinner on your own. Night at Courtyard Charleston Historic District. B







#### DAY 3 - Friday, March 28- Brookgreen Gardens

After our included breakfast, we depart for a guided tour of the varied plant collections, landscapes and sculptures of Bookgreen Gardens. Brookgreen is a unique melding of art, nature, and history. The 9,100-acre property includes themed gardens featuring 1,445 American figurative sculptures as well as trails through nature reserves on the property. Opened in 1932, the garden takes its name from the former Brookgreen Plantation, which dates to the antebellum period. Lunch is in the Harvest Restaurant.

In the afternoon we take a narrated Creek Excursion, a cruise on a 48-foot pontoon boat, passing historic rice fields now home to alligators, waterfowl, and osprey. On the journey, an interpreter helps us see the distinctive landscape of the rice plantations and understand the role of enslaved Africans in the history of the Lowcountry.

After our tour we return to our hotel for dinner on your own. Night at Courtyard Charleston Historic District. B, L







#### DAY 4 - Saturday, March 29- Exploring Charleston

After our included breakfast, we depart on foot for a guided tour of Nathaniel Russel House, which offers a glimpse into the lives of the mercantile elite who flourished in the late Colonial and early Federal period, the artisans and craftspeople they hired to build and adorn their opulent homes, and the enslaved men and women whose forced labor made possible their lavish lifestyles.

Next, we visit Gibbes Museum, established as the Carolina Art Association in 1858. The museum moved to a new Beaux Arts building in the Charleston Historic District in 1905. The Gibbes houses a premier collection of over 10,000 works of fine art, principally American works, many with a connection to Charleston or the South.

After lunch on your own at Oyster House, we meet Susan Epstein for a bus tour of private gardens on Sullivan's Island and Isle of Palms. We enjoy a glass of wine in the last garden of the day.

After a festive afternoon we return to our hotel, for dinner on your own Night at Courtyard Charleston Historic District, B, R







#### DAY 5 - Sunday, March 30 - Lowcountry Plantations

After our included breakfast, we depart for a guided tour at Magnolia Plantation, on the banks of the Ashley River. Magnolia is one of the Lowcountry's oldest public attractions. It is a phenomenal horticultural destination, a significant historic and cultural site, and a place of unparalleled natural beauty.

Within the grounds we find Audubon Swamp, a nature lovers paradise with more than 400 acres of protected wetlands. Some 267 species of birds have been recorded here, and the Audubon Swamp Garden is an ideal place to explore a native cypress swamp.

Our next stop is Middleton Place, located along the Ashley River. Middleton Place is a rare survivor of the American Revolution, Civil War, economic upheavals, and natural disasters. First granted in 1675, this National Historic Landmark connects to the very fabric of our nation's complex history focusing on the contributions of the Middleton family as well as the enslaved Africans and African Americans who lived and worked here. We have a self guided tour, followed by a box lunch in the cafe.

We return to hotel for dinner on your own. Night in Charleston, Courtyard Charleston Historic District. B, L





#### DAY 6 - Monday, March 31 - Beaufort

After our included breakfast, we check out and board the coach for our journey to Beaufort. Just outside of Charleston we stop at the Angel Oak, a magnificent live oak (Quercus virginiana) believed to be nearly 500 years old.

We continue to Beaufort to meet local guide Janet Matlock for a Walking Tour of the parks and historic homes of the city. Along our journey, we stop for lunch on your own at a local restaurant before continuing on with Janet.

Late afternoon we say farewell to Janet and Beaufort to head south into Georgia to Savannah. We check into our hotel before gathering for a group dinner at 45 Bistro. Night in Savannah, River Street Inn. B, D







#### DAY 7 - Tuesday, April 1 - Savannah

After our included breakfast, we hit the streets for a walking tour of the Historic District with Old Savannah Tours. Sites of interest include Basilica of St. John, Andrew Low House, Forsyth Park, Mercer Williams House and the Green-Meldrin House. Lunch is included.

After our tour, we return to the hotel to freshen up before our farewell dinner/cooking demo at Chef Darins. Night in Savannah, River Street Inn. B, L, D







#### DAY 8 - Wednesday, April 2 - Savannah and Departure

After our included breakfast, we have a free morning to explore Bonaventure Cemetery. Originally called Evergreen Cemetery, Bonaventure was a private commercial enterprise, established in 70 acres of the original Bonaventure Plantation. Evergreen was designed as a traditional Victorian cemetery with curving pathways, lots of trees and grassy areas. Although a cemetery, it was common for families to meet and picnic here while still providing a place of comfort and solace for the bereaved friends of relatives of those buried there.

Evergreen was purchased by the City of Savannah in 1907 to become the fourth of the five cemeteries the city currently owns. Since then it has expanded from the original 60 acres to nearly 103 acres.

After our tour, we head to Savannah/Hilton Head International Airport for lunch on your own and flights home. B
